

### What Happened?

An employee was reassembling a LPT run position tool, which consists of an outer cylinder, an inner cylinder and a cap. The inner cylinder became wedged on the outer cylinder, so it was seated approximately 5 inches (13 cm) above its normal seated position. While the employee was installing the cap on the inner cylinder, the inner cylinder descended. The employee's right middle finger was caught between the cap and outer cylinder, resulting in a partial amputation.

Note that this is an initial communication of this event only; the investigation is ongoing.


### **Key Considerations (No Action Required):**

- 1. Engineering is currently evaluating tool design.
- 2. The Incident Investigation is ongoing. When it is completed, an EH&S Alert will be issued for this event, with mandatory corrective actions assigned for all

### Jib Crane Collapse

### What Happened?

An incident recently occurred at a Pratt & Whitney facility in which a half-ton jib crane, holding a 540 lb load, fell and struck an employee. The employee sustained a leg injury and was transported to the hospital for further evaluation.

The initial observation is that the jib was on a section of flooring that was previously wood block and now has two inches of epoxy fill over a concrete base. Groundwater was observed in the lag holes in the floor and the epoxy appeared damaged.

Note that this is an initial communication of this event only; the investigation is ongoing.

### **Key Considerations (No Action Required):**

- 1. Initial observations suggest that there was an epoxy bond failure between the walls of the drilled holes, and that the anchor embedment length (into concrete) may have not met the installation requirements. The investigation is ongoing.
- 2. The following situations may require additional risk assessment throughout facilities:
- Areas that were previously floored with wood block and have been filled with epoxy
- Areas with high water tables that house jib cranes
