Injured at work? What should you do?

- 1. Emergency: Call ext-5111 or call 860-344-5111,
- 2. Notify your supervisor of your injury
- 3. Go to medical for treatment and documentation
- 4. After treatment there will be an investigation to determine root cause and corrective action.
- 5. Make sure a Union Safety Rep. is at the injury Investigation and all information you give is relevant to your job. (Outside of work physical activity is your own private business)
- 6. Be sure to file a Workers Comp Form 30C. If you have any questions reach out to a Union Safety Rep.
- 7. If the company forces you to make a statement, make it under duress and call a Union Safety representative.

Report all injuries as soon as they happen to prevent any complications for yourself. Injuries are considered reported "late" after 24 hours. We should all strive to work safely and avoid injuries but when accidents happen, seek care immediately.

Check Your Sheets, Cover Yourself:

Brothers and sisters, we recently had another incident in CSMC with a dropped part. Investigation was done and this drop was due to an employee using the incorrect lifting device. Thankfully this incident did not result in an injury. Unfortunately the platform was damaged and the part had to be sent to MCL for testing to determine if it can be used going forward.

RTX defines the cardinal rule for hoist and rigging as "using the appropriately rated lifting device and using safe lifting techniques." If you are unable to locate the lifting device called out in your work instructions, notify your supervisor. If instructed by anyone to use an improper lifting device request a Union Safety Rep. immediately.

No production is worth the risk of serious injury or death from a failed load. Be smart, be safe, and always follow the work instructions.

Together, For Safety!

Recently Wayne and I were contacted by an employee of the West Palm Beach about an issue they were having regarding lifting limits. After talking with the employee and arming them with information on how Middletown handles such issues they sat to meet with management. A few days later I received a thank you email with a success story of management realizing they had no fight and were being forced to do the right thing. This is a perfect example of Union solidarity. Only together can we be the change we want to see. Many hands make light work.
